**Course Description:** Oppressive regimes continue to constrain culture and freedom of expression. Taking an interdisciplinary approach, this course explores how totalitarianism has used music as an instrument of propaganda and control, and how musicians/activists have resisted. We will concentrate on Nazi Germany, the Soviet Union and the Middle East (especially Iran). The course covers Western art music but also other styles of music that have flourished under totalitarian regimes.
