Clinical practicum placements will take place in community centres, hospitals, senior residences, nursing homes, Alzheimer's and memory clinics, Parkinson's research and treatment centres as well as the UofT Music and Health Research Collaboratory (MaHRC). Examples of activities include performing music, teaching music, leading singing and instrumental improvisation activities, and using music to enhance speech or mobility.
