BIOGRAPHIES

Lorenzo Guggenheim is recognized for leading opera, new music and the broad orchestral repertoire. He performed in the Teatro Colón at age 23, with the Orquesta Sinfónica de Chile in 2014, with Seattle Symphony's Prokofiev and Shostakovich Festivals in 2016-18, and was twice a Fellow with Music Director Ludovic Morlot. Past engagements include the Orquesta Sinfónica de Mar del Plata, Entre Ríos, University of Washington Symphony Orchestras, Opera and Modern Ensemble, Miami Music Festival, and Orchestra Toronto. In 2018 Lorenzo moved to Toronto where he co-founded the U of T Campus Philharmonic Orchestra and conducted the North American premiere of Toshio Hosokawa's The Maiden from the Sea in collaboration with the composer. Lorenzo Guggenheim holds a Master's degree from the University of Washington and is currently a doctoral student under the mentorship of Uri Mayer thanks to a scholarship from the Faculty of Music.

Soprano Maeve Palmer is an alumna of the University of Toronto, the Rebanks Family Fellowship and International Performance Residency Program, and the Orpheus Choir of Toronto Sidgwick Scholar Program. She is the second prize winner of the 2017 Eckhardt-Gramatté National Music Competition. Maeve is currently studying with Lorna MacDonald at U of T Opera where she will perform the roles of Susanna in

Mozart's Le Nozze di Figaro, and Mary Crawford in Jonathan Dove's Mansfield Park. Recent performances include Zerbinetta (Ariadne auf Naxos) (Highlands Opera Studio), the Canadian premiere of Samuel Andreyev's chamber cantata Iridescent Notation (New Music Concerts), Sandrina and Serpetta (La Finta Giardiniera) (U of T Opera), and Honegger's King David (Chorus Niagara). Maeve Palmer's voice is featured in the Hollywood film The Space Between Us and the TV series Aftermath.

Originally from Prince Edward Island, baritone Parker **Clements** is a graduate of the Master's of Literature and Performance program at the University of Western Ontario. While there, he had the opportunity to perform with the Opera Workshop as Escamillo (Carmen), and Marco (Gianni Schicchi), as well as Don Giovanni at l'Accademia Europea dell'Opera. Since graduating, Parker has appeared as soloist in Handel's Messiah with the Confederation Centre Chorus and members of the PEI Symphony, as well as Brahms' Requiem with Luminous Ensemble. After moving to Toronto, he sang the role of The Lecturer in Dominick Argento's solo baritone opera A Water Bird Talk. He also performed in SOPAC's production of Menotti's The Telephone. He joined the University of Toronto Opera Diploma program in September 2019 and will play Bartolo in their fall production of Le Nozze di Figaro.
